

INVITATION to CTAs

The Transactional Analysis community has many levels of practitioners. Historically much emphasis has been placed on the training, trainees and trainers. This has precluded some beneficial inclusion to the Transactional Analysis practitioner once training is completed. It has been of international concern that our trained and CTA level practitioners have not had a place to roost. It is the attempt of several people in the Australian and New Zealand Transactional Analysis community to rectify this issue.

As a result this invitation is extended to Certified Transactional Analysts (CTA). These practitioners may have chosen not to do the final CTA exams and who would like to remain a member of our community. We invite you to attend the residential training at Kimi Ora in October where we are offering a programme specifically designed for clinicians as well as trainees.

This workshop will be held in conjunction with that offered to trainees, Provisional Trainers and Supervisors of Transactional Analysis (PTSTAs) and the Trainers and Supervisors of Transactional Analysis (TSTAs). It is important to note that the CTA timetable is specific to our clinical work. Although the program is specific to this level of practitioner, some program events will be held within the larger group which is traditional in the Transactional Analysis community. This gives experience in the richness and diversity of working with our RMT's PTSTA's, TSTA's and now our CTA's. (Please see the attached timetable).

The CTA programme will include presentations, literature reviews, supervision and discussions about practice. CTA's should prepare a presentation on some aspect of theory or practice and a book or article review.

The residential workshop will be held from Saturday October 10th to Friday October 16th in Kimi Ora Resort, Kaiteriteri, (near Nelson) in New Zealand.
